GIFTS OF LOVE Community Christmas store brings holiday cheer to thousands while raising funds for City Impact Center

or 17 years, a team of dedicated volunteers has helped make Christmas a time of happiness and hope for low-income families and children right here in Lincoln.

What began as a desire to give gifts to a few local families, who might otherwise have none, has turned into the Gifts of Love community Christmas store. The store provides families with the opportunity to give gifts during the Christmas season while raising money for the brand new City Impact Center, scheduled for completion in 2014.

More than 1,500 children were pre-registered for Gifts of Love. The store was open for five days at First Baptist Church, near 14th and K streets. From Dec. 12-14, parents were invited to shop. Children and teens participating in City Impact programs earned vouchers and were invited to the store to purchase gifts for their family members Dec. 16-17. By the time the 2013 store closed, more than 3,000 people felt its impact.

"The most important thing we do is provide a sense



"Parents get to shop for their children, and the children get a chance to shop for their family members. Every item is either donated directly, or purchased with donated funds, and then marked down to 70 percent off the retail price."
