The extensive menu includes traditional favorites like tacos, enchiladas, and burros, as well as several combination plates and house specials.

If you want to spice up your life, try the Theresa's Special—diced beef with jalapenos, tomatoes, crushed chilis, yellow peppers, green chile strips, and onions. Or for more of a mild flavor, try one of the green chile dishes. "Once you've tried our green chile, you'll never want to get it anywhere else," says Chayres. "We've had customers that have traveled all over and they come back and tell us they can't find any other place that has the type of quality and flavor that we have."

In addition to the restaurant dining experience, Raul and Theresa's also offers a full catering service for community events, weddings and
