

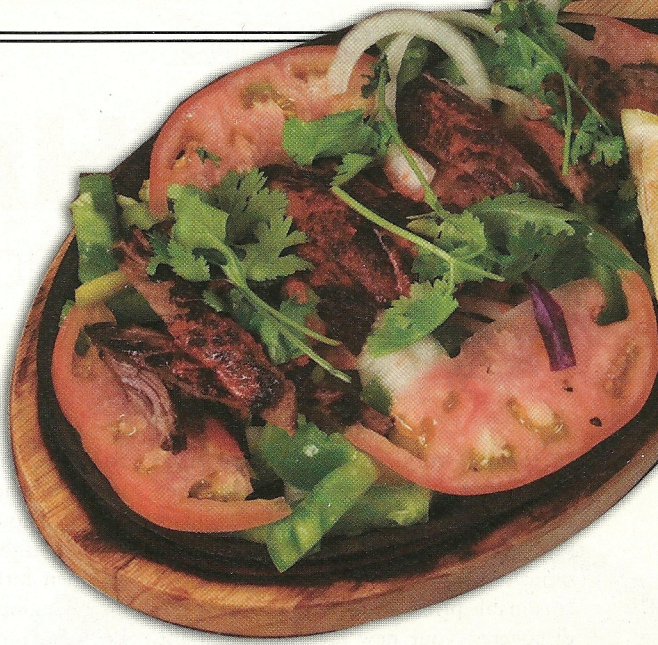

Las Fuentes patrons are greeted the moment they walk through the front door by members of the attentive staff, ready to serve beautiful plates full of mouthwatering Mexican cuisine.

“What sets Las Fuentes apart from other restaurants is the authenticity of our recipes,” Landa says. “Everything is made with only the freshest produce and spices.”

Start your meal with an order of fresh guacamole or, if you’re looking to begin with a bit of spice, try the Camarones Ahogados—shrimp cooked in lemon juice with sliced lemon, onions, jalapenos and cucumbers, and topped with sliced avocado. Next, you can order traditional favorites like fajitas, chimichangas or burritos, or you can try one of the Especiales, served with a side of refried beans and rice.

“Try the Carnitas Uruapan,” Landa urges. “It is a dish representative of the region where we grew up. Tender pork is simmered for hours in beer and spices, and

then grilled until it becomes caramelized and crispy on the outside while juicy and tender on the inside.”

If you’ve managed to save room for drinks or dessert, you will not be disappointed. You can keep it light with a scoop of vanilla ice cream, or indulge with cheesecake, flan, churros y chocolate or capirotada. Las Fuentes also offers a full bar drink menu which includes a variety of soft drinks, beers, wines, and mixed drinks to accompany your meal.

In addition to the lunch and dinner menus, Las Fuentes is also a popular destination for Sunday brunch.

“Our Sunday brunch is an experience to be shared with your loved ones,” Landa says. “We offer a variety of your favorite Mexican food, an omelet and taco bar, fresh fruits, and Mexican pastries and desserts. And, of course, complimentary all-you-can-drink champagne.”
